Minutes Annual Business Meeting International Society of Hymenopterists Beijing, People's Republic of China July 25, 2002

The Annual Business Meeting was called to order at 10:15 am, following three and one half days of superb symposia at the 5th International Conference of Hymenopterists at the Beijing Fragrant Hill Hotel, July 22-26, 2002. Presiding were John LaSalle, President, Lynn Kimsey, President-Elect, Denis Brothers, new President-Elect, Jim Woolley, Secretary, and John Huber, Treasurer. About 100 members were present.

- 1) Minutes of the last ABM in San Diego, California, December 12, 2001, were read. Mike Schauff moved approval, John Noyes seconded, motion to approve minutes passed by voice vote.
- Denis Brothers announced that the sixth International Conference of Hymenopterists will be held in South Africa in 2006. Denis described potential venues and asked for input on the type of venue from members.
- 3) John LaSalle delivered a President's Report in which the following issues were addressed:

- 4) The next International Conference of Hymenopterists will be held in 2006 in South Africa. The ICH is now on a four year cycle and on a two year offset with the International Congress of Entomology.
- 5) The next International meeting of ISH will be held as an evening meeting at the International Congress of Entomology in Brisbane in August 2004.
- 6) LaSalle announced that the ISH Endowment Fund has been established in the amount of \$25,000. For the time being, the funds are invested in a money market account in College Station, Texas. LaSalle asked for suggestions for members to serve on an Endowment Committee to manage the ISH Endowment Fund.
- Eric Grissell will soon retire as editor of Journal of Hymenoptera Research. We will need to find a new editor in about one year. LaSalle asked for suggestions.
- 8) Jim Woolley presented a Secretary's Report (attached). At the present time the Society has 343 members compared with 355 members at the end of 2001. However, because there are 62 members that have not yet renewed for 2002, this may actually represent a further increase in membership. A listing of numbers of members by country was presented.
- 9) John Huber presented a Treasurer's Report for 2001 (attached). Income from dues, sales of back orders of JHR, donations, reprints and page charges and interest on bank accounts totalled \$17,661.57. In addition, the Canberra conference returned a profit of \$6,352.32 US and royalties from the sale of the book resulting from the Canberra conference returned another \$1,061.63. Expenses for postage and supplies, bank fees for credit card transactions totalled \$1,354.69. Charges for printing, mailing and reprints for 10(1) and 19(2) of JHR (not including reprints for 10(2)) totalled \$16,690.32. Together with the carryovers from 2000 in the Ottawa and Texas accounts, we ended the year 2001 with a balance of \$31,701.36.
- 10) On behalf of Eric Grissell, Jim Woolley read the Editor's report for volume 10 of Journal of Hymenoptera Research (attached). Issue 10(1) of JHR was mailed on 26 April and issue 10(2) was mailed on 7 November. The two issues of Volume 10 totaled 281 pages and included 21 articles and one scientific note. During 2001 a total of 23 manuscripts were received. Of these, 17 were accepted after review and rewrite, 1 was rejected, and 5 more are still under review. In most cases, each paper was read by two reviewers a subject editor and the editor, in a few cases a subject editor acted as one of the two reviewers. Grissell expressed his gratitude for the work of reviewers and the four subject editors: Sydney Cameron, Don Quicke, Wojciech Pulawski and Mark Shaw.
- 11) ISH Awards. LaSalle described the process that was used to determine the recipients of the ISH Distinguished Research Medal and ISH Distinguished Service Award. He appointed a committee consisting of Andy Austin, Sydney Cameron, Donald Quicke, Phil Ward, and himself to assess the two nominees for the ISH Distinguished Research Medal. The ISH Research Medal has been awarded to Dr. Charles Michener, University of Kansas and the Service Medal to Dr. Jim Woolley, Texas A&M University. Dr. Michener was unable to attend the ICH to receive the award, and Lynn Kimsey and Jim Woolley will arrange for a presentation ceremony at University of Kansas. LaSalle presented Woolley with a certificate for the Service Award.
- 12) LaSalle commended the organizers of the 5th International Congress of Hymenopterists for a superbly organized meeting and the participants for an excellent series of presentations. The Presidency was passed to Lynn Kimsey.
- 13) Announcements
- 14) A Scientific Forum and Annual Meeting of ISH will be held as an Informal Conference during the Annual Meeting of the Entomological Society of America, in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, November 17, 2002.
- 15) Proceedings of 4th ISH Congress in Canberra are still available in book form, and all royalties from the volume will continue to be directed to the ISH Endowment Fund.
- 16) New Business
- 17) President Kimsey commended the organizers of the 5th International Congress of Hymenopterists for a superbly organized meeting and the participants for an excellent series of presentations. In particular, Kimsey wished to recognize the high quality of the student papers and posters, and recognized the courage many of the student participants displayed in presenting their papers in English.
- 18) Increasing the ISH Endowment Fund will be a high priority for President Kimsey.
- 19) Kimsey wishes to continue to identify and enroll new student members, including sponsored student members.
- 20) The ABM adjourned about 11:30 am.
